

Course Description

JOU1946 | Journalism Internship | 1-3 credits

Qualified students will receive practical experience working with local or college communications media under the supervision of professional media specialists and the journalism faculty. Prerequisite: JOU1100 and permission of department faculty is required. This course may be repeated for credit and is not automatically transferable.

Course Competencies:

Competency 1: The student will be proficient in applying journalistic principles and practices in a professional setting, demonstrating effective communication, critical thinking, and ethical decision-making in news reporting and content creation by:

- 1. Researching and gathering information from diverse sources to support news reporting and content creation
- 2. Interviewing a variety of sources and effectively extracting relevant information for news stories
- 3. Writing and editing news articles that adhere to industry standards and ethical guidelines
- 4. Fact-checking and verifying information to ensure the accuracy and credibility of news content
- 5. Adhering to deadlines and producing high-quality news articles within specified timeframes
- 6. Collaborating with editors and senior journalists to refine writing style and enhance storytelling techniques
- 7. Utilizing multimedia tools and platforms to enhance the presentation and delivery of news stories
- 8. Conducting investigative journalism to uncover and report on significant issues and events
- 9. Engaging in newsroom discussions and contributing to editorial meetings to pitch and develop story ideas
- 10. Applying critical thinking skills to analyze and interpret complex information for news reporting
- 11. Demonstrating an understanding of media law and ethical considerations in news reporting and content creation
- 12. Utilizing social media and digital platforms to engage with audiences and promote news content
- 13. Adapting to different journalistic formats, such as print, online, broadcast, and multimedia storytelling
- 14. Demonstrating effective communication skills in interactions with sources, colleagues, and the public
- 15. Reflecting on and evaluating personal growth and learning experiences throughout the internship period
