

Course Description

JOU 2200 | Editing and Makeup | 3 Credits

The application of copy desk techniques, including evaluating and editing copy, correcting faulty news stories, handling wire copy, writing headlines, and designing page layouts. Prerequisite: JOU1100.

Competency 1: The student will demonstrate proficiency in applying editing principles and makeup techniques to enhance the quality and presentation of journalistic content by:

- 1. Applying editing principles to identify and rectify major areas of concern in draft journalistic content, ensuring accuracy and clarity
- 2. Utilizing peer reviews and editing checklists to assist in revising and editing journalistic materials
- 3. Revising and editing draft journalistic content to produce a final version that meets professional and editorial guidelines
- 4. Employing makeup techniques to enhance the visual presentation of journalistic materials, including layout and design considerations
- 5. Demonstrating the ability to estimate the length of stories, identify type class and size, and lay out front and inside pages following layout principles

Learning Outcomes:

- Communicate effectively using listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills
- Solve problems using critical and creative thinking and scientific reasoning
- Formulate strategies to locate, evaluate, and apply information

Competency 2:

The student will have developed a comprehensive understanding of the editorial process and visual presentation techniques in journalism by:

- 1. Analyzing and applying various visual presentation techniques, such as layout design and graphics integration, to enhance the aesthetic appeal and reader engagement of journalistic materials
- 2. Integrating the use of multimedia elements, including photography and videography, to complement and enrich the storytelling aspect of journalistic content
- 3. Evaluating and implementing editorial feedback to refine the clarity, coherence, and overall impact of journalistic materials, ensuring alignment with professional standards and audience expectations

Competency 3:

The student will demonstrate the ability to critically evaluate and enhance the visual and editorial aspects of journalistic materials by:

- 1. Employing advanced graphic design and layout techniques to enhance the visual appeal and readability of journalistic materials, ensuring a seamless integration of textual and visual elements
- 2. Analyzing the effectiveness of various editorial styles and applying appropriate revisions to improve the overall coherence, tone, and impact of journalistic content
- 3. Collaborating with peers and industry professionals to receive constructive criticism and feedback, and integrating diverse perspectives to refine the visual and editorial components of journalistic materials
