

Course Description

MLS4198 | Immunohistochemistry Clinical | 5.00 credits

This clinical course will introduce the students to the basic immunohistochemistry techniques as applied to the routine anatomical pathology laboratory.

Course Competencies:

Competency 1: The student will demonstrate clinical expertise in immunohistochemistry by:

- 1. Performing routine immunohistochemistry staining procedures
- 2. Troubleshooting Immunohistochemical procedures due to fixation errors
- 3. Troubleshooting specimen size and processing and pretreatment
- 4. Performing quality control requirements of Immunohistochemical specimens

Competency 2: The student will demonstrate the ability to communicate and use interpersonal skills effectively by: Demonstrating ability to give and follow directions
