

Course Description

MSL3202 | Leadership and Ethics | 3.00 credits

This course explores leader responsibilities that foster an ethical command climate. Students will learn to develop Cadet Leadership competencies, and apply principles and techniques of effective written and oral communication. Prerequisite: Cadets Eligible to Contract per ROTC Enrollment Officer and/or MAN2021.

Course Competencies:

Competency 1: The student will demonstrate an understanding of current supervision and management topics by:

- 1. Defining stress management
- 2. Defining ethical behavior
- 3. Describing how effective supervision and management can help manage stress within the organization
- 4. Describing a code of ethics and ethical behavior
- 5. Demonstrating the importance of being an ethical role model

Competency 2: The student will demonstrate appropriate leadership characteristics by:

- 1. Applying situational leadership actions in leading a small unit
- 2. Analyzing the factors that motivate soldiers

Competency 3: The student will demonstrate ROTC values and ethics by:

- 1. Explaining the Rules of Engagement and the Law of Land Warfare
- 2. Applying the Warrior Ethos

Competency 4: The student will demonstrate personal development by:

- 1. Applying principles of time management, effective writing, and communications
- 2. Presenting practical briefings

Competency 5: The student will demonstrate an understanding of the duties of an officership by:

- 1. Describing the Brigade Combat Team
- 2. Explaining Army Full Spectrum Operations

Competency 6: The student will demonstrate an understanding of the required tactics and techniques by:

- 1. Applying the Operations Orders Process
- 2. Demonstrating knowledge of Platoon tactical operations
- 3. Explaining Forward Operating Base (FOB) Operations

Learning Outcomes:

- Communicate effectively using listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills
- Solve problems using critical and creative thinking and scientific reasoning
- Demonstrate knowledge of ethical thinking and its application to issues in society
