

## **Course Description**

## NUR2420L | Obstetrical Nursing Clinical Lab | 1.00 credit

This course provides an introduction to obstetrical nursing clinical practice. Students will learn to apply the nursing process to the care of clients in selected obstetrical clinical settings. Prerequisites: NUR1211, 1211L, 1214C or NUR1002, 1002L, 1141; Corequisites: NUR2310, 2310L, 2420, 2680L

## Course Competencies:

**Competency 1:** The student will summarize the care of the normal antepartum client by:

- 1. Identifying maternal hormones produced during pregnancy, their target organs, and their significant effects on pregnancy
- 2. Discussing common discomforts in pregnancy with nursing interventions
- 3. Describing danger signals in pregnancy
- 4. Identifying community resources for the childbearing family
- 5. Describing the components of initial and subsequent prenatal visits
- 6. Calculating the estimated date of delivery
- 7. Describing the gravity and parity with four- and five-digit systems
- 8. Differentiating assessment techniques for fetal well-being and maturity
- 9. Analyzing the effects of different life situations on nutritional patterns and ways nutritional health can be improved

**Competency 2:** The student will summarize the care of the client with antenatal complications by:

- 1. Defining and identifying factors that make a pregnancy high risk
- 2. Identifying common illnesses that can result in complications when they exit during pregnancy
- 3. Analyzing ways that nursing care can remain family centered
- 4. Analyzing ways that nurses can help prevent complications of pregnancy

**Competency 3:** The student will summarize the care of the average intrapartum client by:

- 1. Describing the physical, psychological, family, and cultural assessment factors that affect childbirth
- 2. Defining the regular progress of each stage of the labor process
- 3. Determining the use of electronic fetal monitors
- 4. Distinguishing different methods of pain relief comfort measures
- 5. Identifying elective and operative procedures
- 6. Describing the immediate nursing care of the newborn in the delivery room
- 7. Collaborating with other health care team members to meet the laboring client's needs

**Competency 4:** The student will summarize the care of the client with intrapartum complications by:

- 1. Discussing high-risk fetal and maternal conditions that are apparent at the onset of labor
- 2. Describing maternal complications that occur during the stages of labor
- 3. Recognizinghigh-risk fetal complications that occur during labor
- 4. Identifying psychological issues and family coping behaviors that arise from complications during childbirth
- 5. Explaining the role of the nurse during obstetrical emergencies
- 6. Generating community health referrals as needed for home management for high-risk clients

**Competency 5:** The student will summarize the care of the average postpartum client by:

- 1. Differentiating the fundamental physiological and psychological changes that occur in the postpartum period as a woman's body returns to its prepregnant state
- 2. Identifying organs that will not return ultimately to a prepregnant state following childbirth

- 3. Explaining the role transition to parenthood for both men and women
- 4. Giving examples of the nutritional needs of the postpartum client
- 5. Explaining pain management needs of the postpartum client
- 6. Evaluating and determining the teaching and learning needs of the postpartum client
- 7. Generating community and home health referrals as needed
- 8. Discussing the collaborative care of the client needed during the postpartum period.

**Competency 6:** The student will summarize the care of the client with a postpartum complication by:

- 1. Describing thromboembolic disorders that occur during the postpartum period
- 2. Differentiating early and late postpartum hemorrhage and selecting the appropriate care plan
- 3. Describing reproductive and nonreproductive organs that are prone to postpartum infections and select the appropriate plan of care
- 4. Identifying childbirth trauma injuries
- 5. Discussing postpartum psychological complications and their management
- 6. Planning home health discharge teaching needs
- 7. Determining available community health resources

**Competency 7:** The student will summarize the care of a normal newborn by:

- 1. Prioritizing nursing responsibilities for the neonate during the transition from intrauterine to extrauterine life
- 2. Differentiating normal variations in newborn characteristics from abnormal findings including care implications
- 3. Analyzing the nutritional requirements for the neonate
- 4. Discussing an assessment tool for determining gestational age
- 5. Describing the effects of medications administered during the neonatal period

Competency 8: The student will describe care management of the newborn and family with complications by:

- 1. Identifying the impact of the high-risk neonate on the family unit
- 2. Identifying nursing measures related to the pathophysiology of respiratory distress syndrome
- 3. Discussing asphyxia with nursing implications
- 4. Discussing common complications of the newborn
