

Course Description

NUR2520 | Psychiatric Nursing | 2.00 credits

This course introduces students to the basic concepts of psychiatric nursing. Students will learn to provide care in in-patient and community settings, focusing on the nurse's role in meeting the needs of the patient, family, and the community. Prerequisites: NUR1211, 1211L, 1214C or 1002, 1002L, 1141; Corequisites: NUR2520L

Course Competencies:

Competency 1: The student will identify the importance of biological psychiatry to the understanding of the etiology of selected mental illnesses by:

- 1. Describing the anatomy and physiology of the brain
- 2. Identifying the significant neurotransmitters and how they function as neuro-messengers in influencing behavior/mood
- 3. Identifying laboratory tests pertinent to diagnostic evaluation

Competency 2: The student will describe the assessment tools used in mental health/mental illness by:

- 1. Recognizing the DSM-IV classification system
- 2. Recognizing the multi-axial assessment
- 3. Identifying the components of a mental status assessment

Competency 3: The student will understand the legal implications in the care of a psychiatric client by:

- 1. Explaining the Baker Act procedure
- 2. Summarizing the Patient Bill of Rights
- 3. Describing the support provided by the community agencies and organizations for clients experiencing disruptions in mental health

Competency 4: The student will discuss the role of the nurse-client relationship in a psychiatric setting by:

- 1. Discussing the therapeutic use of self
- 2. Reviewing therapeutic and non-therapeutic communication
- 3. Comparing and contrasting the phases of the nurse-client relationship
- 4. Identifying the different roles of the psychiatric nurse in a psychiatric facility

Competency 5: The student will describe the principles of crisis intervention by:

- 1. Differentiating normal anxiety from pathological anxiety
- 2. Identifying the different types of crises
- 3. Identifying factors that contribute to crisis development
- 4. Describing the role of the nurse in crisis intervention
- 5. Identifying support systems and community agencies
- 6. Identifying appropriate diagnostic studies used in assessment
- 7. Identifying clinical manifestations
- 8. Describing the collaborative management of clients in crisis situations, including delegation of responsibility
- 9. Selecting appropriate therapeutic approaches/intervention
- 10. Discussing the nursing process's use as a framework for individualized care
- 11. Discussing the educational needs of clients and their families
