

Course Description

PAS4590 | Obstetrics/Gynecology | 2.00 credits

During this clinical course the student will participate on the obstetrical service managing pregnancy, labor and delivery and be introduced to pre-and postnatal complications. The student will also participate in the management of common gynecologic problems. Prerequisites: PAS3019, 3042C, 3070, 3140, 3203C

Course Competencies:

Competency 1: The student will demonstrate competence in patient care and apply clinical skills by:

- Communicating effectively with patients, family members, and the healthcare team in a respectful and professional manner while receiving and giving feedback during H&Ps, office visits, ward rounds, case presentations, and counseling when indicated
- 2. Developing competence in women's medical interview and physical examination and incorporating ethical, social, and diverse perspectives to provide culturally competent health care
- 3. Counseling patients concerning the expected course of an illness and pregnancy and the therapy regimen selected
- 4. Demonstrating effective use of motor and cognitive skills in diagnosing, managing, and preventing common health problems encountered in Obstetrics/Gynecology
- 5. Performing prenatal evaluation, including recommendations and rationale for immunizations, screening tests, and prophylactic treatments
- 6. Formulating a differential diagnosis and patient treatment plan that includes appropriate subspecialty consultation and therapy when necessary
- Choosing diagnostic and therapeutic management strategies for patients with common issues arising during pregnancy from both acute and chronic care needs
- 8. Formulating comprehensive care plans that demonstrate effective use of the primary care team and community resources and ensure adequate follow-up
- 9. Choosing appropriate pharmacologic agents, considering actions, indications, and contraindications to treat the disorders /diseases listed

Competency 2: The student will value professionalism and socialization in the physician assistant profession by:

- 1. Practicing ethical decision-making, exhibiting honesty and integrity in patient care, and being sensitive to cultural issues
- 2. Exercising accountability, being conscientious, on time, and responsible, maintaining a professional appearance, and working in a collegial manner with other healthcare team members
