

Course Description

PHT2820 | Clinical Practice and Conference III | 7.00 credits

This course provides advanced clinical experiences in patient care activities under the direct supervision of a licensed physical therapist. Prerequisites: PHT2162, PHT2701, PHT2701L, PHT2810; Corequisite: PHT2931

Course Competencies:

Competency 1: The student will read selected patient's medical records by:

- 1. Examining patient records and progress notes
- 2. Utilizing medical terminology
- 3. Identifying patient responses that would require the immediate attention of the supervising physical therapist
- 4. Documenting patient response and treatment

Competency 2: The student will document daily notes by:

- 1. Entering and writing patient documentation in a timely, accurate, and organized format
- 2. Providing billing and reimbursement information under the supervision of the clinical instructor

Competency 3: The student will render patient care in an ethical, legal, safe, and effective manner by:

- 1. Applying legal and ethical standards under the APTA Code of Ethics
- 2. Applying legal and ethical standards under the Florida Physical Therapy Practice Act

Competency 4: The student will demonstrate effective interaction with patients and families by:

- 1. Performing in a manner that provides psychological support
- 2. Determining the cultural and socioeconomic differences when communicating with patients, families, and co-workers

Competency 5: The student will assist in the clinical process by:

- 1. Participating in the discharge planning process
- 2. Assisting in determining the appropriate patient staffing requirements
- 3. Conducting follow-up procedures as determined by the clinical instructor

Competency 6: The student will demonstrate effective written, oral, and nonverbal communication with colleagues and other healthcare providers by:

- 1. Reading patient records
- 2. Participating in staff meetings
- 3. Identifying facial and body language consistent with treatment response

Competency 7: The student will keep the clinical instructor informed of patient progress, as depicted in the plan of care, progress summary, and daily progress notes by:

- 1. Identifying when modifications may need to take place secondary to changes in the patient's condition as a result of the application of modalities covered in the objectives of Clinical Education such as:
 - a. Patient Positioning
 - b. Gait training with assistive devices and guarding
 - c. Techniques appropriate to the patient's diagnosis
 - d. Transfer training
 - e. Wheelchair instruction
 - f. Exercise appropriate for the patient's diagnosis
 - g. General neurological techniques

- h. Pulmonary hygiene techniques
- i. Basic wound care within the scope of practice for the assistant

Competency 8: The student will be able to assist the physical therapist/ physical therapist assistant in the collection of the following data by:

- 1. Performing girth measurements
- 2. Performing manual muscle testing
- 3. Performing flexibility of motion measurements
- 4. Performing vital signs
- 5. Analyzing posture
- 6. Performing pain assessments
- 7. Performing skin and sensation integrity
- 8. Performing leg length discrepancy measurements
- 9. Analyzing gait deviations in neuro, prosthetics, and orthopedic patients
- 10. Analyzing righting and equilibrium reactions

Competency 9: The student will monitor the patient's response to treatment by:

- 1. Identifying when modifications are needed, secondary to change in patient's status
- 2. Identifying when treatment interventions should be discontinued

Competency 10: The student will utilize primary neurodevelopmental sequence when treating pediatric by:

- 1. Applying the developmental sequence
- 2. Identifying appropriateness of primitive reflexes

Competency 11: The student will be able to identify possible home architectural barriers by:

- 1. Appraising existing home environment
- 2. Recommending possible variations depending on the patient's level of function

Competency 12: The student will be able to educate the patient, family member, and caregiver by:

1. Developing home exercise programs

Competency 13: The student will be able to incorporate didactic knowledge by:

- 1. Utilizing previous clinical experiences
- 2. Implementing an appropriate number of treatments per day
- 3. Organizing treatment efficiently and timely
- 4. Integrating treatment techniques for patients with multiple disabilities

Competency 14: The student will adhere to the assigned clinical site policy and procedures as outlined in their emergency preparedness plan by:

- 1. Reading emergency preparedness plan
- 2. Participating in clinical site orientation
