

Course Description

PRN0082C | Anatomy and Physiology and Medical Terminology 2 | 3.50 credits

This course is designed to provide the student with an increasingly complex knowledge of normal human body structure and function. The student will learn major systems, organs and terminology necessary for the provision of safe and effective nursing care. Prerequisites: PRN0000C, PRN0022C, and PRN0030 (80 Contact Lecture Hrs., 25 Contact Laboratory Hrs.)

Course Competencies:

Competency 1: Describe the structure and function of the respiratory, cardiovascular, muscular- skeletal, nervous, skin, and sensory systems of the body

Competency 2: Describe the structure and function of the reproductive, urinary, digestive, and endocrine systems of the body
