

Course Description

PRN0130C | Special Populations | 5.00 credits

This course examines the application of nursing to the care of special populations throughout the life cycle. Emphasis is placed on nursing care of clients with psychosocial disorders, childbearing women, newborns, and children to promote independence, wellness, and maximizing quality of life. Prerequisites: PRN0080C and PRN0204C (75 Contact Lecture hrs., 75 Contact Clinical hrs.)

Course Competencies:

Competency 1: Demonstrate how to care for maternal/newborn clients, utilizing nursing principles

Competency 2: Demonstrate how to care for pediatric clients, utilizing nursing principles

Competency 3: Describe human growth and development as it relates to pregnancy, pediatric, and mental health populations
