

Course Description

SPT2842 | Contrastive Analysis Spanish/English | 3.00 credits

This course covers the comparison/contrastive study of the phonology, morphology and syntax of Spanish and English. Recommended for students of translation and interpretation.

Course Competencies

- 2. Using basic sentence structure in English and Spanish
- 3. Understanding English phrasal verbs vs. one-word Spanish verbs

 - a. Nouns and articles
 - b. Adjectives
 - c. Possessive and demonstrative adjectives and pronouns
 - d. Expressions of possession
 - e. English and Spanish personal pronouns
 - f. Reflexive and reciprocal actions III
 - g. Verb phrase complementation
 - h. Adverbs and prepositions

Competency 3: The student will learn syntactic and lexical variances by:

- 1. Using the following verbal structures:
 - a. Tenses/simple and compound
 - b. (2) Voice/active and passive
 - c. Constructions; (3) mood /indicative/subjunctive/participial/conditional/imperative)
 - d. The Spanish imperfect-preterit contrast
 - e. The Spanish subjunctive
 - f. Spanish and English verb construction- the gerund
 - g. The Passive voice/contrast
 - h. Verb contrasts
 - i. Passive constructions
