Miami Dade College Launches New Presidential Scholars Program

Unique Opportunity to Join a Society of Changemakers with Concierge Services and a Pathway to America's most Renowned Universities

Miami, July 26, 2021 – In its continuing efforts to provide greater access, Miami Dade College (MDC) has launched the Presidential Scholars Program, a new initiative offering high-performing graduating high school students in Miami-Dade County the opportunity to complete an associate degree at no cost beginning this fall term. More importantly, the program offers scholars a unique opportunity to join a society of changemakers with individualized services and hundreds of seamless transfer opportunities to the nation's top universities.

Presidential Scholars must have cumulative weighted GPA of 3.50 or above. The scholarship award will cover tuition and fees, and provide a stipend for those who qualify. In addition, students will have access to assigned advisors and support in a number of areas, including program orientation, learning resources, career tracks, student life, community involvement, financial coaching, mentoring and much more. They will also have the opportunity to regularly meet with the College President, distinguished alumni and top industry leaders.

MDC remains committed to enhancing equity and access for all students, offering a wide range of scholarships, other financial assistance to support students during every step of their education pathway and wrap around services with additional resources. In addition to the new Presidential Scholars Program, the College recently created the Rising Black Scholars Program, which provides Black high school graduates with free tuition for up to two years, and Fast Track Sharks, designed to help incoming freshmen transition to college.

"Helping students reach completion is more important than ever and doing so with comprehensive support mechanisms and concierge services makes all the difference, said **MDC President Madeline Pumariega**. "We are extremely pleased to provide these new opportunities."

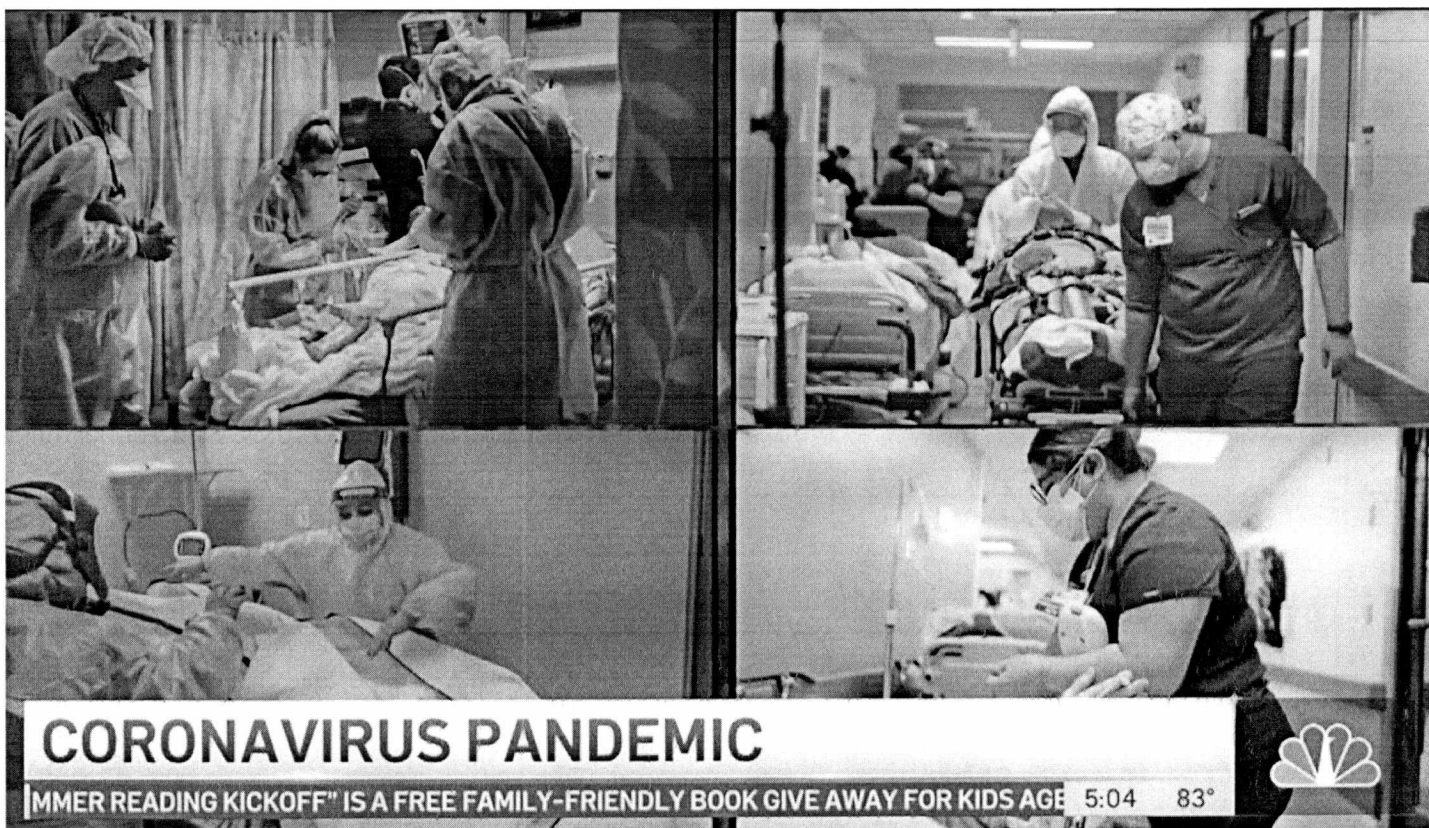

As the highly infectious Delta variant and others become the more prevalent Covid-19 strains, the county is also encouraging everyone, not just those who are unvaccinated, to mask up.

"We also strongly recommend everyone wear masks in large crowds or around those they don't know to be vaccinated and get tested if you are experiencing Covid-19 symptoms," Mayor Levine Cava said.

"We have come too far and made too much progress to go back now."

For vaccinations, pre-registration is not required but encouraged. IDs and insurance cards are also encouraged, but not required. For an update on Florida eligibility criteria, visit:

For testing, no symptoms are required, but are asked to bring a photo ID. Insurance cards are encouraged, but not required. Testing is available for children and adults. There are no restrooms available for public use and testing is available to anyone regardless of where you live.

Good evening everyone, my name is Alice Muniz, and I AM MDC.

I am a 34-year-old single mom. I am presently a third-semester nursing student at the Benjamin Leon School of Nursing at Miami Dade College.

I was born and raised in Staten Island, New York. I am the youngest of three children. While growing up, my brother was a sick child and my mother made the decision to give up her nursing career and be a stay-at-home mother. My father worked two full-time jobs to make sure his children had a better life. As a little girl, my mom would tell me; "You should be a nurse because you are so caring and loving." Fast forward a few years, when I was in high school, a tragic event occurred, 9/11. At that time my father was a computer consultant at the World Trade Center, when the building came down, so did our source of income. However, my mother would not allow this hurdle to get in our way. After, 15 years of being out of the field, she returned to nursing.

In 2004, I graduated high school and decided to follow my siblings and move to Tallahassee, Florida. I enrolled in Tallahassee Community College. In 2006 I realized I was not mature enough to go on with my college career. So, I enrolled in cosmetology school and completed the course of study in 2007. In March of that year, I moved to Miami, to do an internship in cosmetology. I loved the culture and the atmosphere in Miami, and I knew it would be a great place for my parents to live.

My father was the first to move here, after 6 years of looking for employment in NYC, he found a job in Miami and started his new job in the spring of 2007. My mother stayed in New York working as a Licensed Practical Nurse and going to school to pursue her dream of becoming a Registered Nurse. Knowing she would be relocating in the fall of 2007, I asked my cosmetology clients, "What is the best nursing school in Miami? They all said Miami Dade College makes the best nurses." I knew when my mom got here where I would take her to register.

In December, I asked my mom to go for a drive with me. I drove her to Miami Dade College's Medical Campus and enrolled her in school. She started at MDC in the Spring of 2008 and graduated with an Associate Degree in Nursing in 2010. In 2012 she graduated again with a bachelor's degree in nursing. In 2014, she returned to MDC as a nursing instructor. Presently, she is an assistant professor at the School of Nursing, and she is pursuing her Ph.D. in nursing. I did join my mom as she pursued her associate degree, but again I was not ready for college.

In 2016, I had my beautiful daughter which is my biggest blessing. In 2019, 10 years after I first enrolled in MDC, my daughter fell ill. I was forced to take a leave of absence from my job. Human resources informed me they would not hold my position. That was my "ah-ha" moment that pushed me to go back to school. I re-enrolled in MDC college in pursuit of a Nursing Degree. Again, there would be obstacles in my school journey.

In March of 2020, the world came to a complete halt when Covid 19 hit. I had to juggle being an online student, a mom, and a teacher as my daughter was now also taking classes online. With everything going on, it drove me even more to be a nurse. I wanted to be able to help my community and save lives. With all the struggles and obstacles in my way, I was able to maintain a 4.0 GPA, make the Dean's List, and be accepted into the associate of nursing program at MDC. Nursing school has

not been easy. It is probably the hardest thing I have ever done. Fortunately, it has been rewarding. I am able to give back to my community. I have administered over 100 Covid-19 vaccines at local community sites to Miami-Dade residents. I will be finishing nursing school in December 2021. Upon graduation with my associate degree, I will be returning for my bachelor's in nursing.

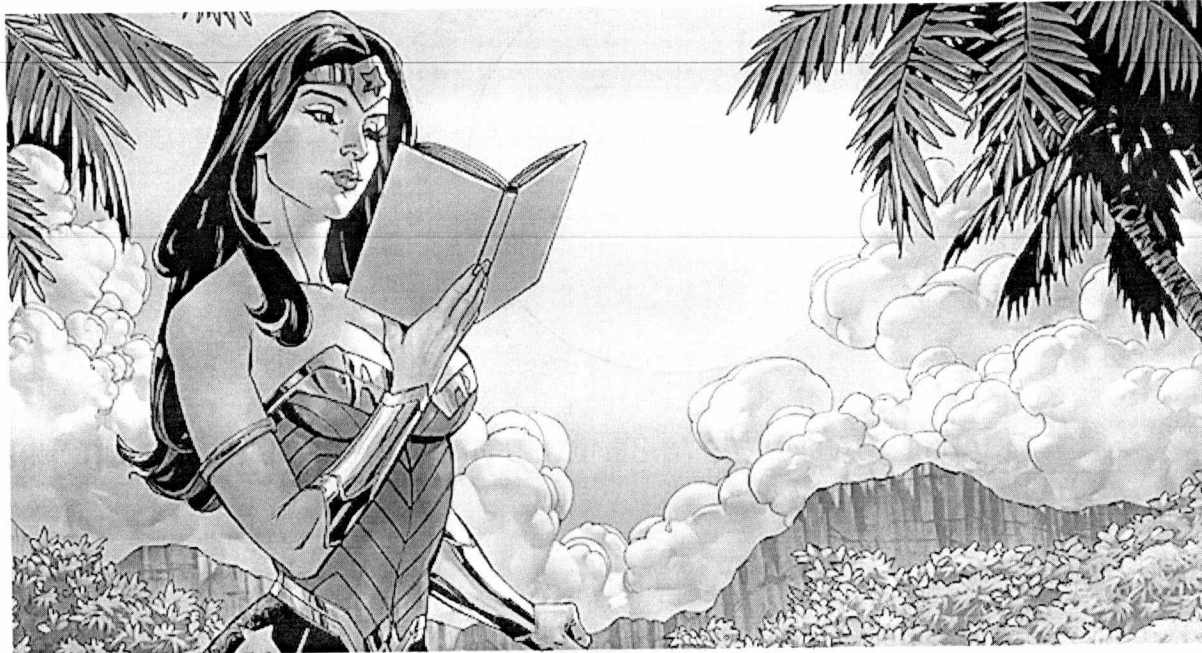

I knew I was meant for more, as I taught nights at the local community college and found true enjoyment in the classroom environment.

I always felt like I belonged more as an educator, even from that first teaching gig. Flashback to 2008–2009 when I was partly laid off from *The Miami Herald*. I thought all was lost, after over 15 years of a journalism career. Then, a former professor from Florida

International University contacted me to teach a class at the school. Nervous, I took the leap, and I fell in love with teaching. I'll never forget when the students, some older than me, brought me a cake for my birthday and said I helped them so much with their education. I was floored, and I continued my adjunct teaching career, even if it meant working nights and weekends after leaving the newsroom. I had found my calling. Nullifying Nicaragua: Ortega Still Keeping Rivals In Jail — To Keep Them Out Of Election

Nicaraguan strongman Daniel Ortega has thrown more than 20 presidential candidates and opposition leaders in jail this summer. What should the U.S. and world do?

On June 8, Nicaraguan presidential candidate and human rights activist Felix Maradiaga walked into a prosecutor's office in Managua to answer questions about his political activities. On his way in, he urged supporters to use non-violent resistance against the authoritarian Sandinista regime of President Daniel Ortega.

Then, minutes after Maradiaga walked out, he was arrested for treason — that is, for having criticized Ortega, which under a new law in Nicaragua effectively means treason. Maradiaga is still being held and is believed to be in the notorious El Chipote prison in Managua.

Maradiaga's wife, Berta Valle, and their 7-year-old daughter live here in Miami for security reasons. Before his arrest, Maradiaga spoke with them every night from Nicaragua. When those calls stopped, Valle had to tell their little girl what happened.

"She told me, 'Mom, is my dad alone, by himself, in this place?'" Valle told WLRN. "So I said, 'No, he has company, you know — there's Doña Violeta Granera, there is Juan Sebastián [Chamorro].' So she was, like, relieved to know that her dad was not alone."

Hardly alone. Along with Maradiaga and the other opposition presidential candidates Valle mentioned, Ortega had at least four other presidential hopefuls and opposition leaders arrested that first week of June.

Since then, the number of political opponents Ortega has put in jail or house arrest has grown to more than 20. All of them face what human rights groups call bogus treason charges. Valle, a former TV news anchor and opposition congressional candidate in Nicaragua who's also in the Ortega regime's crosshairs, says she's not been allowed contact with her husband since his arrest.

"We haven't heard about him, we don't know how he is," Valle said. "We don't know if he's taking his blood pressure medication related to his heart. For us, he's disappeared — but our daughter knows it's because he's doing something hopeful for Nicaragua."

Ortega is likely to keep Maradiaga and the others disappeared at least until next week. Legal registration for Nicaraguan presidential candidates begins Wednesday, July 28, and ends Monday, Aug. 2.

If they're locked up during that time, the left-wing Ortega will face no real opposition in the Nov. 7 presidential election. Critics say he can then continue the corrupt and brutal dictatorship he's built since he was elected president 15 years ago — and, for the past five years, with his wife Rosario Murillo as vice president.

"What we have in Nicaragua is not a common dictatorship — it is a rather insane regime," said Nicaraguan expat Francisco Larios, a Miami Dade College economics professor and editor of the political and cultural magazine *Revista Abril*.

Larios points out Ortega and Murillo have created an erratic personality cult that, among other bizarre acts, ordered massive street rallies across Nicaragua last year in reckless defiance of the COVID-19 pandemic. Larios also notes rights groups blame their security forces for killing 328 protesters since anti-government protests began in 2018.

Ortega denies the charge and calls the people who were killed "terrorists." Still, Larios says Ortega can't risk a legitimate election.

"This is a guy who cannot afford to leave power, because [he's facing charges of] crimes against humanity as violent as any that we have had in Latin America," Larios said.

"So the whole election system is set up to prevent any result against him."

Because of that, Larios and much of the Nicaraguan diaspora in South Florida feel Ortega's opponents and the world should forget about trying to remove him through elections.

But relatives and representatives of the Nicaraguan candidates Ortega has jailed say those opposition figures don't regret having tried the elections route. For one thing, they point out, their good-faith democratic effort makes Ortega's despotic governance even more apparent to the world.

"We knew conditions for a transparent election weren't in place when we started campaigning this year," said Jonathan Duarte, Maradiaga's campaign manager.

"But campaigning was the best way we could simultaneously fight for those conditions. And we didn't want the conditions to come a month before the election and we hadn't done any campaigning."

Duarte said even when the opposition candidates were allowed to campaign, the Sandinista regime kept their activities tightly restricted. In one provincial town, where

of nuns let his campaign use their convent for a "spiritual retreat" where supporters could hear his speech and ask him questions via Zoom and Skype.

At this point, however, Duarte concedes the opposition and international community may ultimately have no choice but to nullify the November election results and "declare Ortega illegitimate."

Which is why Nicaraguan expats like Larios are urging the United States to exert more pressure on the regime — starting with seizing hundreds of millions of dollars they say the Nicaraguan military has stashed in banks and markets around the world.

"What we want is the world to hit the regime where it hurts," Larios said.

The Trump Administration did levy targeted economic sanctions on the Ortega regime. Congress looks set to pass a bill, the Reinforcing Nicaragua's Adherence to Conditions for Electoral Reform (RENACER) Act, which potentially imposes more sanctions, such as restricting international lending to Nicaragua.

Miami Congresswoman Maria Elvira Salazar recently introduced the Nicaragua Free Trade Review Act that could boot Nicaragua from CAFTA, Central America's free trade agreement with the U.S.

The most immediate aim is to get Ortega to release the political prisoners — like Juan Sebastián Chamorro. His wife Victoria Cárdenas was on Capitol Hill last week.

"President Biden, as a candidate, made a commitment to centering human rights and democracy in U.S. foreign policy." Cárdenas told WLRN. "We urge him to keep that commitment in Nicaragua."

Cárdenas testified along with Valle, Maradiaga's wife, hoping to retain Washington's focus on Nicaragua amid the crises in Haiti and Cuba.

Like Duarte, they said it was necessary for figures like Chamorro and Maradiaga to represent the hope of dislodging Ortega democratically. But Cárdenas agrees that if they and the other candidates remain in jail, the world should not recognize Nicaragua's election.

"I don't believe if the candidates are not able to register before August 2," Cárdenas said, "that we can call legitimate elections on November 7."

Cárdenas points out there are higher stakes at play as well.

"As wives and mothers, we're asking for the reappearance of the people that have been disappearing in Nicaragua the past six weeks," she said.

Nicaraguan political experts say chances are they could reappear from jail next month, once they're no longer a threat to Ortega as November opponents.

But the chances of democracy reappearing in Nicaragua any time soon look more remote.

Want to Run a Food Truck? Here's your Chance.

Free program provides valuable instruction on operating a food truck business



Miami Dade College, Brightline, and the Neighbors & Neighbors Association (NANA) have partnered to create The Food Truck Enterprise Program, a free 14-week initiative that provides valuable instruction on the fundamentals of operating a food truck business. In addition, the program will give three entrepreneurs the opportunity to purchase or rent a customized food truck.

The program runs from September 13 through December 17, 2021, and offers four weeks of training at NANA and 10 weeks of classes at MDC's Hospitality Institute in tandem with the School of Business at Wolfson Campus. NANA is a nonprofit organization that works with Overtown residents. The

Hospitality Institute provides Miami's under-represented residents with job opportunities in hospitality and tourism by offering free, hands-on training at various sites.

Food truck participants must have previous culinary training or work experience. Preference will be given to Overtown residents but anyone can apply.

"I'm very proud that Miami Dade College is spearheading this opportunity." "There's so much for our students to gain from the program," said Shelly Fano, chair of MDC's Miami Culinary Institute, Hospitality Management Program and executive director of MDC's Hospitality Institute.

Participants will receive instruction in food safety and sanitation, business operations, marketing, restaurant service, kitchen skills, entrepreneurship and more. Students will take industry-recognized exams offered through the American Hotel and Lodging Educational Institute, assuring they meet high industry standards. They must also participate in a competition judged by a panel of industry experts who will select three winners based on a business plan detailing the cuisine, menu, marketing strategy, and designs for the truck, plus a final culinary demonstration. The winners will have the option to buy or lease a food truck.

NANA is providing inventory and licenses for the award recipients. Additionally, Brightline will donate three parking spaces for the food trucks at the MiamiCentral train station to help secure an established customer base.

Upon successful completion of the training and exams, all participants will receive:

- MDC Certificate of Completion
- Industry recognized hospitality certification
- ServSafe Manager Certification

Peloton Bikes in College Towns

There are two reasons I wanted to write this blog post on Peloton bikes in college towns. One, if you have a child in college or university, you may want to know about Peloton hotels when you visit them. Two, you may be interested to know about colleges and universities that have Pelotons on campus if you go back for homecoming, parents weekend or just a little trip.

So, given the first point—looking for a Peloton hotel in a college town. This information would have been helpful for my husband and me. Why? We're both riders, and we recently took a short vacation to a college town.

Peloton bikes in college towns

So, here is how I put this blog post together. First and foremost, it is an alphabetical, state-by-state list of college towns with Peloton cycles somewhere in town. This includes gyms and fitness centers with Pelotons as well as hotels with Peloton bikes. In addition, I've rounded up campus fitness centers or workout rooms that have a Peloton.

Speaking of colleges and universities with Pelotons on campus, you need to keep the following in mind. Some of these cycles are in campus fitness centers and are for student use. However, others let parents buy a day pass. These will help you keep your Peloton streak going while you are on campus.

State by state list of college towns with Peloton bikes

Again, this is an alphabetical list, by state, of college towns with Peloton bikes. Some are on college campuses. Others are adjacent to or near the local college or university.

As of this writing I have 25 states included; this includes the District of Columbia.

You can book directly on the Marriott site for the Aloft Tempe. The hotel is just a mile away from ASU and has at least one Peloton bike on site.

Graduate Hotel Tempe

When it comes to proximity to Arizona State University, [The Graduate Hotel Tempe](#) is situated across the street from Sun Devil central. And what about Pelotons? Well, the fitness center has one Peloton bike.

The Westin Tempe

This is one of the newest Peloton hotels in a college town. [The Westin Tempe](#) opens this summer and has one Peloton bike in its 24-hour Westin Fitness Studio.

[According to the hotel website](#), "For collegiate sports lovers, Arizona State University's Sun Devil Stadium [is] just minutes away." The ASU campus, though, is just steps away from the hotel.

California college towns with Peloton bikes

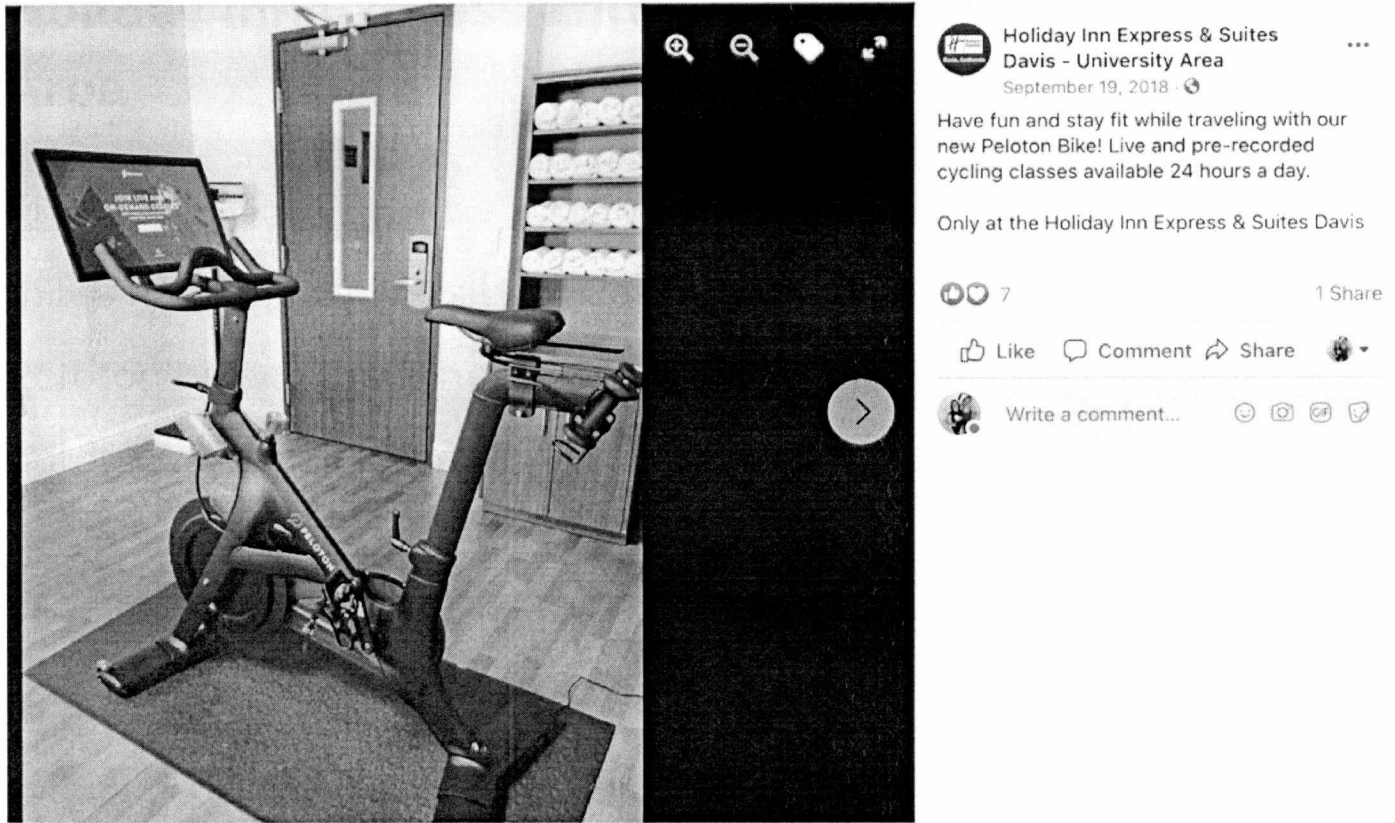
Berkeley

Estados Unidos mantendrá las actuales restricciones de viaje para entrar en su territorio ante los aumentos de los contagios con la variante delta del coronavirus, que en el caso de este país ha provocado un fuerte aumento de los casos.

La portavoz de la **Casa Blanca**, **Jen Psaki**, confirmó este lunes que la intención del Gobierno que preside **Joe Biden** es la de mantener las actuales restricciones.

Psaki recordó que la variante delta se está extendiendo en el país y en el resto del mundo, y en el caso de Estados Unidos ha provocado una nueva ola que afecta sobre todo a las personas no vacunadas, y que esperan continúe en las próximas semanas.

Por otro lado, Psaki consideró normal que las autoridades sanitarias del país mantengan una discusión «activa» sobre las medidas a tomar, incluida la posibilidad de volver a reclamar el uso de la mascarilla en interiores, después de que el principal epidemiólogo del Gobierno, Antony Fauci, admitiera que se está sopesando esa posibilidad.

En cualquier caso, recalcó que el Gobierno tomará las decisiones según las recomendaciones de sus responsables científicos y sanitarios, siempre con arreglo «a los datos» y no como una decisión política.

Los Centros de Control y Prevención de Enfermedades (CDC, en inglés) establecieron en mayo que la población completamente vacunada en Estados Unidos podía permanecer sin mascarilla la mayoría del tiempo, incluso si está en espacios cerrados o con un grupo numeroso de gente.

Pero, este domingo Anthony Fauci admitió que se plantean ahora recomendar que los vacunados vuelvan a llevar la mascarilla, ante un aumento de contagios que está llevando al país «en la dirección equivocada».

Lo que sigue siendo obligatorio en el país hasta septiembre es el uso de las mascarillas en los aviones.

Preguntada sobre si la Administración se plantea extender esa norma por la variante delta, Psaki rechazó ofrecer detalles sobre el debate interno pero adelantó que los CDC están trabajando en unas normas que servirán de guía al público y las aerolíneas.

En cuanto a las palabras de Fauci diciendo que el país va en dirección equivocada, Psaki lo atribuyó al hecho de que todavía hay una buena parte de la población sin vacunar.

Añadió en este sentido que hay que ser «responsables» con los datos y recordar que el 97 % de las hospitalizaciones de las últimas semanas corresponden a personas sin vacunar.

«Los datos siguen demostrando que si estás vacunado, estás protegido, y es muy poco probable que enfermes o seas hospitalizado», añadió.

En la misma comparecencia, Psaki dijo por otra parte que apoya la petición de las organizaciones sanitarias de que sea obligatoria la vacunación entre los profesionales de la salud. Pero recordó que los CDC no dan órdenes sino recomendaciones.

Florida es el estado que registra más casos de coronavirus en Estados Unidos.

Las cifras de contagios de coronavirus vuelven a ser preocupantes en el estado de Florida, tras registrar **73,199 nuevos casos la semana pasada**, lo que significa un promedio de 10,457 al día.

De acuerdo con el último reporte del **Departamento de Salud de Florida**, la tasa de positividad fue de 15.1% y 78 personas murieron a causa del covid-19.

En total, en el estado se han presentado 2,479,975 casos de coronavirus y 38,670 personas han muerto **debido al covid-19**.

Los sistemas de salud y hospitales en el sur de Florida se han visto obligados a suspender las visitas, debido al alto número de pacientes con coronavirus que atienden en sus salas.

El condado Miami-Dade abrió nuevos centros de vacunación debido al incremento de casos de coronavirus.

“ Estamos extremadamente preocupados por esta nueva ola de casos de covid en Miami-Dade. Los números son muy claros: la gran mayoría de los que terminan en el hospital debido al COVID no están vacunados”, dijo la alcaldesa de Miami-Dade, Daniella Levine Cava.

Informó que la mayoría de los contagiados que están en los hospitales no están vacunados por lo que alienta a los residentes a colocarse la inyección contra el coronavirus.

“También recomendamos encarecidamente que todas las personas usen máscaras en grandes multitudes o cerca de personas que no saben que deben vacunarse, y se hagan la prueba si experimentan síntomas de covid-19”, pidió Levine Cava.

Mayoría de contagios son personas que no se han vacunado

Funcionarios del Hospital Jackson Memorial, el más grande del condado Miami-Dade señalaron esta semana que han visto un aumento del 178% en pacientes con covid-19, de los cuales el 95% son personas que no se han vacunado, y más del 40% menores de 50 años.

El sistema de salud Memorial Healthcare por su parte informó que el volumen de pacientes hospitalizados con covid-19 ha aumentado en un 125%, de los cuales 98% no está vacunado.

Los expertos culpan de las altas cifras de contagios a la nueva variante Delta del covid-19, la cual no es solo mucho más contagiosa sino que afecta a los más jóvenes.

Urgen a la población que no se ha vacunado que lo hagan lo más pronto posible.

“Las vacunas no les van a causar infertilidad, con las vacunas no les van a colocar un microchip, ni le va a cambiar el ADN, ni ninguna información genética, las vacunas salvan vidas”, dijo la epidemióloga Dadilia Garcés, del Miami Dade College.

De acuerdo con el último reporte del Departamento de Salud, 245,945 se vacunaron contra el covid-19 la semana que pasó en el estado. De estos 142,045 se pusieron la primera dosis, mientras que 102,909 completaron la serie.

En total 11,469,755 personas se han vacunado contra el covid-19 al menos con una dosis en Florida.

La lucha del entrenador de voleibol de Brasil: pasó 36 días en un hospital en estado grave por coronavirus y hoy su equipo ganó.

El estado de Florida registra un repunte de casos semanales con la alarmante cifra de 73,199 nuevos contagios en la semana del 16 al 22 de julio, un aumento del 60 % respecto de la anterior (45,584

casos), más que ningún otro estado del país, según datos del Departamento de Salud de Florida publicados el pasado viernes.

La tasa de positividad alcanzó el 15.1 %, con un promedio de 10,000 nuevos contagios diarios para un acumulado total de cerca de 2.5 millones de casos en el estado desde el inicio de la pandemia el 1 de marzo de 2020, según el FHD, que ahora solo informa una vez por semana.

El pasado 21 de julio, el coordinador de la respuesta contra el coronavirus de la Casa Blanca, Jeffrey Zients, explicó que tres estados con bajo índice de vacunación, Florida, Texas y Missouri, acumulan el 40 % de los casos. Uno de cada cinco casos de los que se registran en todo el país está en Florida.

Además, la pasada semana se contabilizaron 282 muertes por COVID-19 en Florida, un estado con solo el 48.5 % de su población vacunada completamente y con los hospitales en alerta máxima por el aumento del número de infectados hospitalizados.

Hoy la cadena de hospitales AdventHealth, la mayor del centro de Florida, elevó el nivel de emergencia a rojo debido al aumento veloz de pacientes.

Por su parte, Carlos Migoya, director general del mayor sistema de hospitales del sur de Florida Jackson Health, señaló que ahora el 10 % de los pacientes que dieron positivo al COVID-19 han contraído la cepa que se originó en Colombia.

Las autoridades sanitarias estiman que cerca del 90 % de las personas hospitalizadas por el COVID-19 no han recibido la vacuna.

El gobernador de Florida, Ron DeSantis, se niega, sin embargo, a implementar medidas de prevención obligatorias como el uso de mascarilla, incluido en colegios, y el uso de la distancia social.

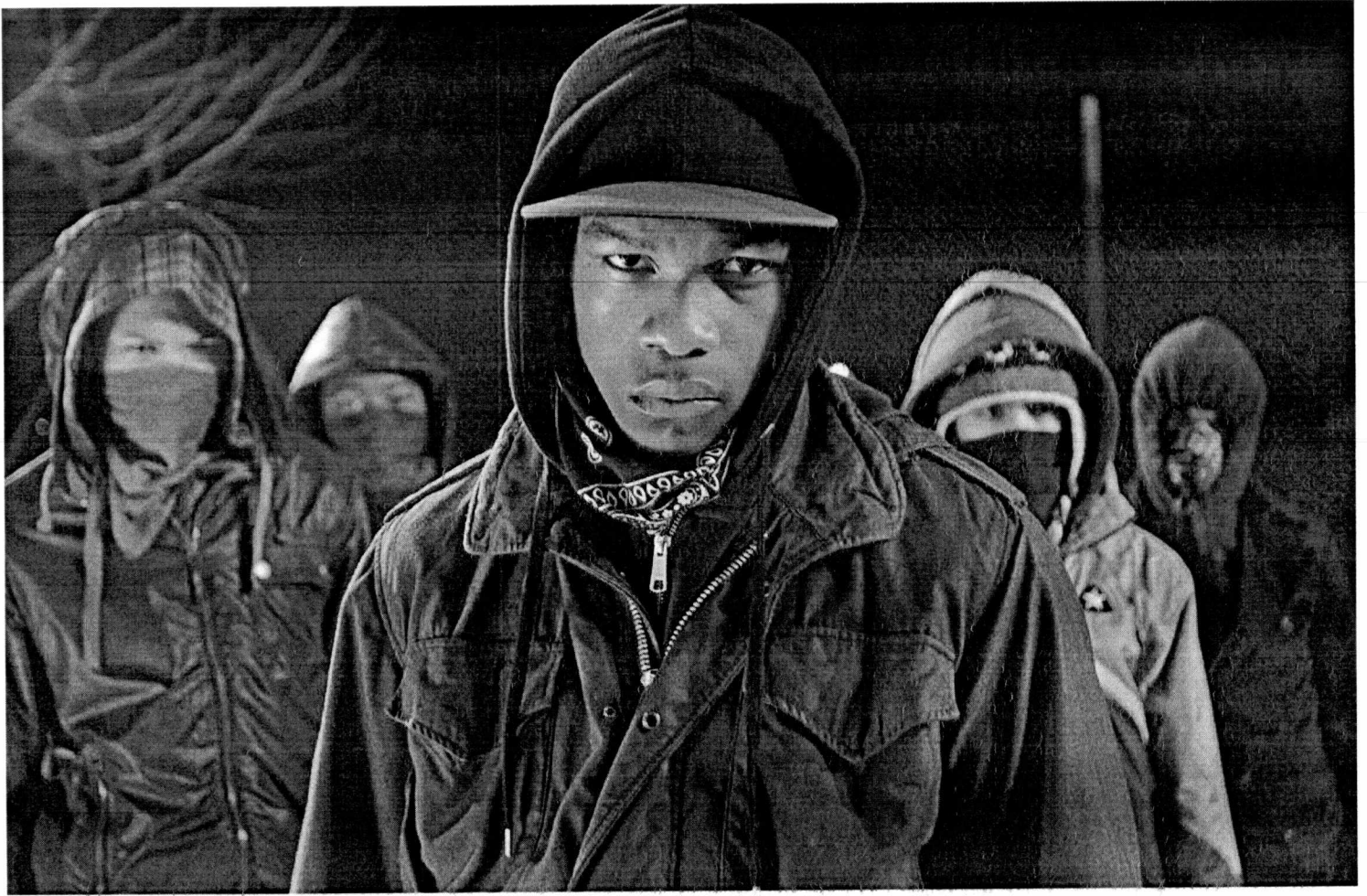

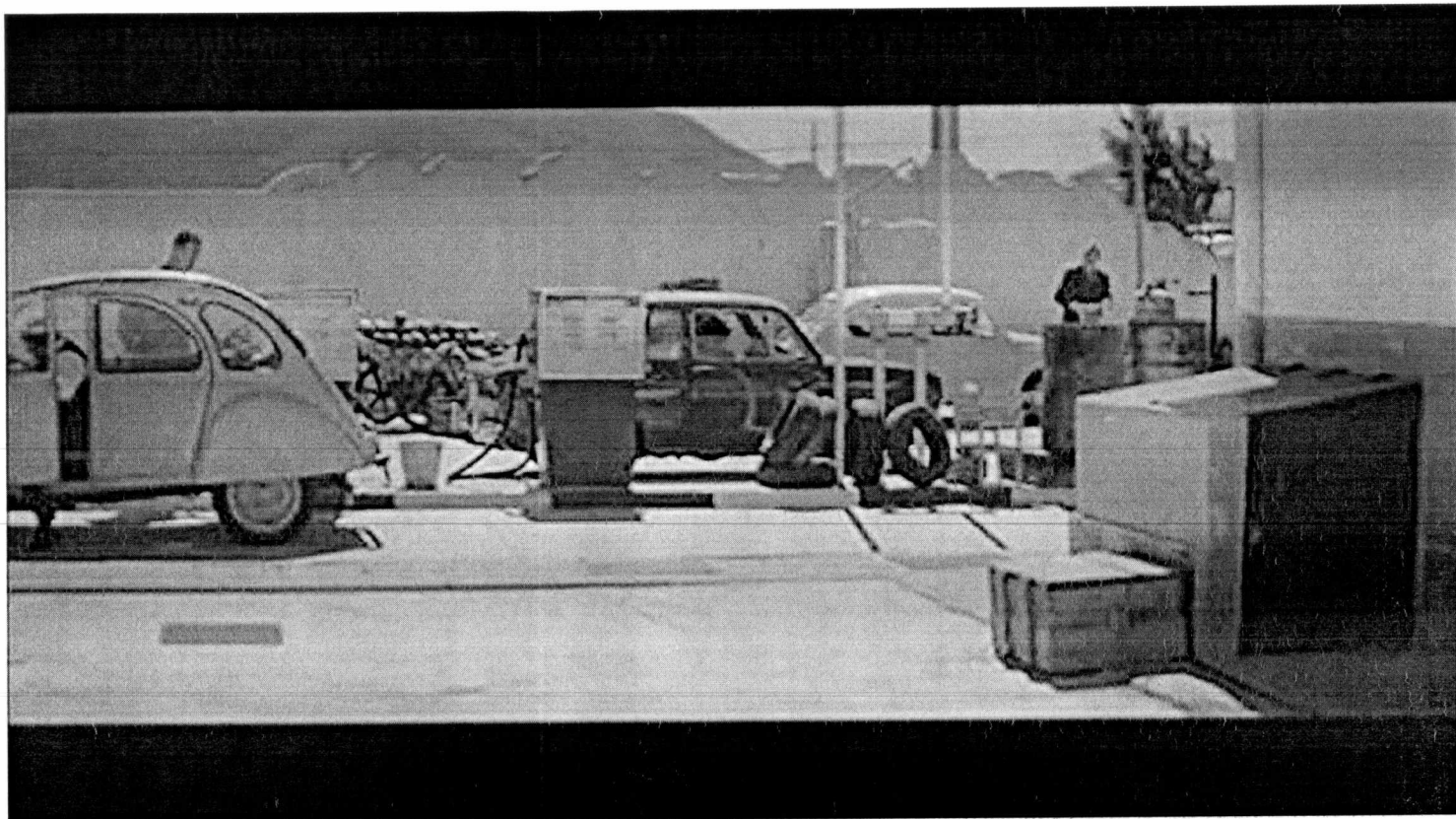

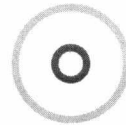
