



Annual tuition and fees for bachelor's degree programs (full-time, 30 credits)



Students are more likely to return if they are:


- Passing their classes

MDC confers more associate degrees than any other community college in the country.

Degrees Awarded Among Large Postsecondary Institutions:

- #1 in associate degrees awarded to Hispanics
- #4 in associate degrees awarded to Black students
- #1 in associate degrees in Liberal Arts and Sciences, General Studies and Humanities awarded to minorities
- #2 in associate degrees in Nursing

MDC ranks #1 for third year in a row for students earning Industry Certifications




Student Engagement


- MDC students are engaged in their studies, a key indicator of student learning and success.
- MDC outperforms the 2022 Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE) cohort, extra-large institutions, and participating Florida College System institutions in Active and Collaborative Learning, Student Effort, Academic Challenge, Student-Faculty Interaction and Support for Learners.

Job Placement

- 85% of Associate in Science graduates are placed in training related jobs. 93% are working just after graduation.
- 78% of Baccalaureate graduates are placed in training related jobs. 95% are working right after graduating.
- MDC AS graduate earnings have been consistently just above adjusted statewide Florida College System AS graduate earnings. AS state earnings are adjusted for the elevated cost of living in Miami-Dade County. (e.g., latest \$63,037 MDC AS earning vs. \$59,620 FCS statewide AS cost-of-living adjusted earning).
