

Transfer Planning Guide: Colleges and Universities' Database

Instructions

Before you identify possible colleges and universities for transfer:

- 1. Think about yourself and the world around you as you respond to these questions
 - a. Do you often encounter people who think or act differently than you? How do you respond?
 - b. What have you learned about yourself and others from these encounters?
 - c. How might this influence your choice of colleges and universities to apply to?
 - d. What interests and activities have you pursued beyond the classroom and outside of the daily routine of MDC?
- 2. Think about your personality and your relationships with others
 - a. How would you want each of the colleges and universities you are researching support your strengths?
 - i. Unsure of your strengths? Click here for a free, online Strengths Finder inventory.
 - b. How do you respond to pressure, competition or challenge? How gritty are you?
 - c. Do you have the maturity and sense of responsibility to handle the freedom and independence of the college environment?
 - d. How well would you do in a college environment away from home?

When you begin to create your list of possible transfer institutions:

- 1. Create your list of institutions that you are considering for transfer. List them on the pages of this Transfer Colleges and Universities' Database. This is your preliminary search that you can fine-tune later. Include in-State and out-of State institutions, and private institutions since they may have more financial resources than State universities. The Common App website facilitates your search of over 700 institutions for you to consider; create a free account and dive in.
- 2. Visit the website of each four year institution on your list.
- 3. Enter your answers to the questions in the Transfer Colleges and Universities' Database.
- 4. Place all this information in a binder or folder so that you have all the necessary materials in one place.
